Grammar, sentence structure, overall tone and style of writing: 30%

Each mistake is worth 10%

AP Style, spelling, capitalization, numbers, etc.: 30%

Each mistake is worth 10%

Following directions: using the proper format, font, spacing, etc.: 40%

If you don't follow directions in any way, shape or form, you start out with a 40 percent deficit.

Each assignment will be read only to the point that it reaches 50 percent. In other words, no complete assignment can receive less than 50 percent of the possible points. I will draw a line across the paper at the point it reaches 50 percent which means that the remainder of the paper will receive no remarks or corrections. Your final feature is an exception to this. It is possible to receive a zero on your final paper.

Assignment instructions (hard copy)

For hard copy assignments use 12-points Times font, like the one in this sentence.

Unless instructed otherwise you should only be putting one sentence in each paragraph and the first line of each paragraph should be indented.

Your copy should be double spaced like this.

Don't forget that spell-check is your friend and can save you valuable points, especially since each misspelling is worth 10 percent of your total score.

Assignment instructions (blogs)

Blog assignments are posted on the blog you created for this class.

Blog assignments should utilize the one-sentence paragraph unless instructed otherwise, however, the format is somewhat different.

Single space your copy and be sure to use a 12-point sans serif font such as Arial or Helvetica.

Do not indent for each new paragraph, but do add an extra return (double space) between each paragraph, like in this example here.

All blog assignments must be posted AND must have the URL emailed to the teacher before the deadline in order to receive credit. The subject line of the email should contain your name, the assignment slug and the time of your class.
